



QUARTZ MANUFACTURING ALLIANCE OF AMERICA ANNOUNCES MEMBERSHIP GROWTH AS INDUSTRY RALLIES BEHIND SAFEGUARD ACTION

U.S. manufacturers and fabricators join QMAA to support domestic jobs, uphold fair competition, and commit to long-term growth of the quartz surfaces sector

Washington, DC (December 2, 2025) — U.S. quartz manufacturers and others across the stone industry are rallying together as foreign suppliers and importers flood the American market with illegally labeled, illegally routed, and artificially cheap quartz products that undercut American jobs. The [Quartz Manufacturing Alliance of America](#) (QMAA) announced a surge of new members joining its effort to stop this illicit trade and restore fair competition in the U.S. stone industry by supporting the safeguard petition that QMAA filed under Sections 201–202 of the Trade Act of 1974.

The additional members' support underscores broad industry commitment to restoring a level playing field and strengthening U.S. manufacturing and fabrication of quartz surface products. Among the growing list of new members are LX Hausys, E-Stone Surfaces, Hendrix Industries, and Hyundai L&C USA. Along with Cambria, Dal-Tile/Mohawk Industries, and Guidoni USA, they cite the importance of QMAA's coordinated policy efforts, data-driven advocacy, and support for American factories, workers, and stone fabrication shops as key reasons for aligning with the organization.

"The growth of our membership reflects a shared commitment, from a broad coalition, to fair competition and American jobs," said Luke Meisner of Schagrin Associates, representing QMAA. "By working together, manufacturers and fabricators are sending a clear message: Enforce existing trade laws, curb evasive practices, and allow this industry—built by U.S. workers—to compete on merit."
